
Priority Site Assessments for Dragonflies

Assess the value of a site based on recent* dragonfly records





Sites can be identified as being of **national importance**, for holding breeding populations of nationally-rare species, or of **local importance**, for holding breeding populations of either locally-important species or a diverse range of species.

Definitions

- * Recent records are ideally those from the last 5-10 years, but up to 20 years for rarely visited, remote sites.
- ** Importance, Diversity & Abundance

Details of Nationally Important Species, Locally Important Species (as determined at the county level), and both Abundance and Diversity thresholds can be found in the Priority Site Assessment Instructions.

*** Breeding

Evidence of breeding includes any of the following:

- Co Copulating (and tandem) pair
- Ov Ovipositing (egg-laying) female
- Sc Willow Emerald Damselfly oviposition scar
- La Larva
- Ex Exuvia
- Em Emergent
